# Tackling Climate Change: Sustainability Survey

# **DN Colleges Group**

## February 2021

A short survey was undertaken at DN Colleges Group, using Microsoft Forms, to ascertain the views of all staff and students on sustainability and tacking the 'climate emergency'. A definition of sustainability was given as: 'responsibly interacting with the planet to maintain natural resources and avoid risking the ability for future generations to meet their needs'. Our strategic objective in this context is to "cultivate and drive forward an ambitious whole-College approach towards net-zero emissions and reducing environmental impact through innovation and collaboration" (DN Colleges Strategic Plan 2020-2022)

433 responses were received: 150 FE students, 93 HE students and 190 staff

- Better recycling, Improved water management, Energy champions identified in all areas of the College
- I would like to see printing across the group lowered!
- I would have like to click more than one to answer number 5 as would like to see all of the suggestions come into effect.
- We currently have bins for recycling paper but we could have compost bins in staff kitchens (emptied regularly) for suitable food waste. An allotment garden feeding the canteen kitchens would be an excellent idea. We could have a community garden where students help to grow fruit and vegetables and these are distributed to students when they harvest.
- Recycling bins in offices, no plastic bottles, electric car/bus fleet
- Encouragement to turn electrical equipment off overnight and over weekends
- Recycling bins in staff rooms
- More recycle bins
- The college already use a lot of recyclable materials, I think the key thing is getting the students to use them. So more focus on education and encouraging recycling as well as other aspects of climate change. There are too many cigarette ends dropped on the floor, too much rubbish thrown on the corridors, seating as well as outside. - It would be nice to have a wildlife area with seating that staff and students can walk around, sit and have lunch and for those studying such subjects use it for study purposes. However, it would be nice to see the college growing its on fresh produce either for use on sight or for resale where staff/students are able to buy reasonably priced goods.
- I would like sustainability to be embedded into the curriculum, for every student to recognise the importance as part of their programme. A short course for example

It could also be donated to the local community like Blue doors. Students could be encouraged to grow the produce which may encourage them/parents to grow things at home.

You can order from Amazon for large areas.

- Separate bins for green waste in Floristry and Catering that are actually kept separate once collected and then the material composted.
- "Go back to the system of internal mail envelopes for delivery of smaller amounts of photocopying. Using new envelopes and new brown paper for parcels is not in line with sustainability.
- Don't ban plastic bottles (yet), what else would go in the vending machines? Encourage use of reusable bottles but ensure there are containers for recycling and that they are in prominent places so that people will use them.
- Encourage staff and students using the coffee shop/food hall, where possible, to bring their own reusable containers for food, as this has the potential to reduce the amount of waste from packaging take-aways.
- Invest in thermostatic radiator valves so that temperatures in individual rooms can be controlled more efficiently.
- Most staff are pretty good at reducing paper/photocopying quantities now but those with high usage can be identified and encouraged to look at alternative ways to provide resources for students and identify what definitely needs to be on paper and what does not.
- Raise the profile of the need to ensure that classroom computers should be turned off at the end of the day encourage academic staff who have the last lesson in a room to make sure students turn off computers before they leave. It could reduce the problem of stifling classrooms in summer months to some extent, particularly in rooms where no fixed cooling system is in place."
- I work in Animal Management at NLC. We wanted to start recycling quite a few years ago and was told that we could do it, but had to buy our own bins and empty them ourselves. So we did. We have used a rota for our student groups and they all get involved emptying them. Our students also produced sustainability presentations with their own ideas on last academic year. We had many ideas, such as collecting rainwater, making greenhouses out of waste plastic bottles, and then growing our own veg for the animals....

For example, many students and staff purchase drinks from the coffee counter but there is no place to recycle the cups at or near that point (e.g. a recycle bin). Also, with a building (DC) with a huge surface area it seems remiss that there are no solar panels on the roof or south-facing sides whilst zones such as LRC3 are 'sun traps' for significant periods of the day but that energy is not harnessed. There are many other similar examples.

- Carbon net zero goals must be balanced and for our provision reducing things like printing is not always the answer; if anything working 12+ hours per day tied to computers has shown that it is better for our health to print articles to read than read from screens (many eye strain headache issues reported across staff teams). Students also report print material aids their study. To meet net zero we need to look at other strategies such as offsetting carbon through carbon credits; even fuel firms can be net zero this way.
